

With the lockdown and closure of schools, digital education has seen a sudden upsurge in India. To achieve academic continuity, children swiftly had to adapt to digital classrooms and online education. While corporate and high-end schools have adapted quickly, children from low-income schools suffered challenges associated with internet access and uninterrupted power supply. Additionally, with loss of employment, parents could not afford to pay fees to enable their children to continue their online education. This became a harsh reality for many resource-poor families during the pandemic.

Amidst these devastating consequences, Sankalp has reached out to 100 girl children and provided scholarships so that they could continue their education on different online platforms.

In addition to scholarships for girl children, Sankalp has supported higher secondary education of students with speech and hearing difficulty.



Sankalp has always stood by the side of needy and deserving girl childrento educate them and making them capable of leading their self-reliant lives. This service being extended even during the pandemic situation is just a proof of the selflessness of the Sankalp organization. Apart from supporting the girl children financially, the organization's efforts to fight against child abuse is just admirable. With COVID 19 and the subsequent lockdown, schools across India were shut down to control the transmission of COVID-19. Since then, children were confined to thier homes for longer periods than ever before. Closure of schools, lack of extracurricular, outdoor activities, and lack of peer-time has changed their daily routines and has stimulated monotony, anguish, irritation, and diverse problems among children. Although home should be the safest place for a child, sexual, psychological and physical abuse have shown a significant rise. Childline in India has received 92,000 SOS calls from children asking for protection from abuse and what is even more shocking is that these were the numbers from the first 11 days of lockdown!!

In the pandemic situation, the responsibility of adults to keep their children safe has become indispensable. To keep our children safe, it is important to talk to our children, educate them age-appropriately about child sexual abuse, create safe circles, and build self-esteem and confidence that trusted adults will support them. Furthermore, talking about sex, sexuality and bodies can help children understand that sex and sexuality are healthy parts of life. Such conversations will enable them to make informed decisions.

To this end, Sankalp has reached out to teachers from 6 private schools, corporates and 52 schools supported government by Cvient. Sankalp conducted virtual awareness sessions to enhance the understanding of teachers on CSA. prevalence, dynamics, its impact. knowledge about potential perpetrators, the importance of educating parents and children, reporting, legislations and their role in creating safe spaces for children.





Let's accelerate girls returning to schools

Let's hold our children's hands and support them to be self-sufficient and self-reliant

Promoting girl child education is critical for both mitigating the effects of the COVID crisis and building resilience against the future. A policy brief on National Forum on Right to Education, released in January 2021, estimated that around 10 million girls are at risk of dropping out due to the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic. The report indicated that the increased dropouts might impact girls by putting them at risk of early marriage, early pregnancy, poverty, trafficking and violence.

With the loss of livelihoods, parents are suffering due to limited resources constraints and are considering curtailing the education of their daughters.

But bringing girls back to schools will enable them to make informed choices and participate meaningfully in the economy.

As we all circumvent the COVID crisis, let's extend our support to embolden girls returning to schools. Contribute towards girl children scholarship, bridge education, their access to online education platforms and a safe environment for children to return to schools confidently.

Your support will go a long way to ease the burden on resource-poor families and give scope for girls to get back to schools.
